Pizza

Please note that with this new year, we have modified the process for ordering pizza. We now ask that you order for an entire month by the Tuesday that precedes the first pizza day of each month. The next due date is January 31! If your

Admission Requirements

- ⇒ DSBN Academy recruits and enrolls students from all 13 municipalities within the Niagara Region. Eligible applicants must meet the following requirements, both at the time of application as well as at enrollment:
- ⇒ Student must be entering Grades 6, 7 or 8 in September.
- ⇒ Student would be the first in their family to graduate from a college or university program. If a sibling of the student has attended a post-secondary institution but the parent(s)/guardian(s) have not, the student is still considered a First Generation Student.
- ⇒ Student must be achieving current grade level expectations or just below.
- ⇒ Student has demonstrated the potential for achieving "good" or "excellent" learning skills, particularly initiative, independent work and responsibility.
- ⇒ Student must be willing to attend a school location that may be out of his/her community.
- ⇒ Student understands that there is a mandatory after-school program which includes enrichment opportunities and academic supports.
- ⇒ Families must understand that it is a single track pathway beginning in grade 9 (Academic Level Only).
- ⇒ Families understand that there is a parent engagement requirement of 15 hours each year.
- ⇒ Applicants must submit a **completed** application by February 6, 2017.



Head Lice

Parents are an important part of controlling head lice. Children are especially prone to these pests as they often play close together where heads may come in close contact.

Remind your children to put their tuques and other headgear in their lockers.

Long hair should be braided or pinned close to the head.

Hats, combs, brushes should not be lent or borrowed, and should be washed regularly.

Check your school age children once weekly for head lice.

Please notify the school immediately if head lice or nits are found.

When a student or students are found to have lice or nits, the parents/

guardians of that (those) child(ren) will be contacted directly. The school sends information home with all students in a class where head lice has been found. This is so that parents may be extra vigilant when inspecting their child(ren)'s head(s).

Thank you very much for your continued efforts to keep this common challenge under control.

Inclement Weather

There may be times during the school year where inclement weather or other situations could cause transportation cancellations or school closures.

At times when student transportation has been cancelled and schools remain open, the decision of whether or not to have children in school on that day rests with the parent or guardian.

Should you decide not to send your child to school in the event that transportation is cancelled but schools remain open, or if your child is ill or late, please ensure that you call your child's school to inform them of your child's absence.

A key resource in any emergency is the DSBN Emergency Information form that you filled out at the beginning of the school year. Please let the school know of any changes in contact information or procedures you wish to be followed throughout the school year.

For secondary schools it may become necessary to cancel late buses. Notice will be provided via school announcements and on the websites and subscription features by 11:30 a.m.

Math Minute(s)

At Stevensville we continue to encourage all students to spend at least 1 hour per week on Dream-Box Learning®'s Math Program (sessions should be at least 20 minutes in length). This program supports students in developing various models for thinking and reinforces important mathematical concepts.

In order to promote this very valuable program, we are continuing our DreamBox Challenge at Stevensville. For this challenge, we calculate average (mean) lessons completed during each month for each class. The classes (in each division) with the highest average for each month will earn a prize. December's winning classes were Mrs. Hennessy's Grade 2 class (the primary race was **close**), Mrs. Hein's/Ms. Davis' Grade 4/5

class, and Mr. Train's Grade 8 class. They will have pizza parties for their hard work. Check out the final results for all classes [here](#). The mean completed lessons among the students at Stevensville for the month of December was 15.

We also honour the students who complete between 20 and 28 lessons in a month because that means they completed (on average) 5 to 7 lessons per week. Those students will have their names posted in the front hall and their names have been entered into a draw to take place later this week. In December, we had 82 students who made that list and therefore have a ballot in the draw! These students are particularly impressive because they completed these lessons in a month with two weeks of winter break! We will draw one name from each division and the lucky winners will receive a Chapters gift

card.

We will also have a separate draw to celebrate students who worked hard on DreamBox over winter break. These committed students will be entered into the draw if they completed ten lessons (5 per week).

Our school challenge will continue in the coming months so please encourage your child(ren) to finish lessons and persevere...and please remind them that every time they make a mistake, their brains grow!
